Trinity Welcomes Guest Preacher Dr. Joseph L. Roberts, Jr.

The Rev. Dr. Joseph Roberts will be our guest preacher on Sunday, September 27.

The Rev. Dr. Joseph L. Roberts, Jr., served as the Senior Pastor of the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, for 30 years. A visionary and gifted leader, he uses his exceptional skills in addressing major issues of our time, creating an awareness in others, sensitizing them to act in meeting the challenges of today. His messages stimulate the mind, are thought-provoking, and get to the heart of the matter. They cause one to think deeply and act compassionately. It is with this type of leadership that Ebenezer continues to be a strong voice for the oppressed and an advocate for justice.

Dr. Roberts is a native of Chicago where he received his formative education in the public school system. He graduated cum laude from Knoxville College. His Master of Divinity Degree was received from Union Theological Seminary in New York City and his Master of Theology degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in New Jersey. Prior to coming to Ebenezer he worked in various administrative positions in the Presbyterian Church, U.S., and was pastor of Weequahic Presbyterian Church and Elmwood United Presbyterian Church in New Jersey. He is the recipient of numerous honors from civic, social, and religious organizations. He has been listed in Ebony Magazine as an outstanding clergy person, and he also is the recipient of five honorary Doctor of Divinity degrees. He was the 2004 recipient of the Distinguished Alumni Awards of both of his graduate schools; Union Theological Seminary and Princeton Theological Seminary. He serves on several boards and committees both locally and nationally.

This multi-talented man of all seasons is an energetic orator and an accomplished musician. He also is an administrative wizard and negotiated successfully in securing bank financing for Ebenezer's new Horizon Sanctuary. To the casual observer this eight-million dollar edifice may be merely a soaring brick building with a magnificent interior. But the structure, dedicated on March 21, 1999, is much more. Everything from construction materials to interior design to the location of the property encompasses the early roots of the Christian religion, along with the symbols of our African American heritage.

During the past quarter-century of Dr. Roberts' dynamic leadership, many new members have been added (more than 2000), and financial giving has increased more than 300 percent. When he took the helm at Ebenezer, he launched an expansive community outreach program that included the Teenage Mother's Ministry, a tutoring program, counseling, a food co-op, and a seniors' day care center. He envisioned starting a parochial school that would concentrate on providing a good education and clear role models for youth, particularly young males.

Dr. Roberts' book, "Sideswiped By Eternity," sermons from Ebenezer Baptist Church is now available at Borders, Barnes and Noble, and Cokesbury bookstores and at the Ebenezer Baptist Church.

Dr. Roberts was recently selected to be the Wade Huie Professor of Preaching and the director of the new Center of Preaching at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta.

Dr. Roberts and his wife, Esther Wortham Roberts, are proud parents and grandparents. They have one son, Carlyle (C.J.), and two daughters; Cheryl (Leslie) Richmond, Cynthia (Sonny) Emory, and 6 grandchildren.

Trinity Presbyterian Church and Others Sponsor Atlanta Mayoral Candidates Forum

The Buckhead Council of Neighborhoods and Trinity Presbyterian Church, along with other neighboring houses of worship including St. Anne's Episcopal Church and Ahavath Achim Synagogue, will jointly sponsor an Atlanta Mayoral Forum at Trinity Presbyterian Church, 3003 Howell Mill Road, on Tuesday, September 22, at 7:00 PM. Confirmed participants include Atlanta mayoral candidates Lisa Borders, Mary Norwood, Kasim Reed, and Jesse Spikes. The event is free and open to the public, and local political commentators Bill Nigut, formerly with WSB-TV and current Regional Director of the Anti-Defamation League, and Dick Williams, host of Fox 5's Georgia Gang, have agreed to moderate the forum.

The sponsoring groups are extremely pleased that the top four mayoral candidates will appear to address residents' questions and concerns on such key issues as public safety, taxes, finance, parks, schools and transportation. The evening will encourage both the candidates and the audience to focus on issues that are specific to the Buckhead area, as well as issues important to all Atlanta.

Questions are being submitted in advance by neighborhoods and the faith community. In addition, residents will be able to submit questions on provided index cards on the night of the event. Moderators Nigut and Williams will pose questions to the candidates throughout the session, which is expected to last two hours.

Jim King, chairman of the Buckhead Council of Neighborhoods and president of Chastain Park Civic Association, said, "The upcoming mayoral race is extremely important to the future of the areas represented by the BCN. In November, we will have a chance to make our voices heard. We hope that the Atlanta Mayoral Forum will generate a lot of interest, excitement, and debate about the upcoming election and contribute to greater turnout at the polls."

Trinity Presbyterian Church Acting Senior Pastor David Burns adds, "We are excited about the opportunity to host this important forum and to allow voters the chance to hear directly from the candidates. We are especially grateful that Trinity can play a role helping voters understand more about the candidates' positions on the important issues/future decisions that will face the next mayor of Atlanta."

Walk with Me Curriculum: Church School for Younger Elementary Students

We are blessed at Trinity to be part of a church that makes sharing the stories of faith with our children a priority. Our Pre-K- to 3rd grade-aged children use the “Walk with Me” curriculum to guide them through Scriptures and help them continue to build their faith. “Walk with Me” is designed to educate and guide children through biblical literacy and faith development in a kid-friendly approach. Children are taught Bible stories in a fun, interactive style, drawing upon the multiple intelligences approach to learning that engages these students. As you walk the halls of buildings A and D you will hear lots of discussion, the acting out of stories, and even a few rowdy games as the children engage with one another about their lesson, learning to relate the pages of scripture to their everyday life experiences outside the church. “Walk with Me” exposes the children to a wide-range of Old and New Testament stories and builds knowledge of God’s salvation history. Thanks to our volunteer teachers and staff who help our young children grow as they continue their journey as God’s children!

Sustainability Matters

In the beginning . . .

When it comes to sustainability and the church, let's start at the beginning. Genesis 1:1? Well, not that beginning. Another beginning might be the report on “Restoring Creation for Ecology and Justice,” adopted in 1990 by the 202nd General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This document outlines the harm already done to nature and human beings, acknowledges the church's important role in this work, and recommends steps we can take, as individuals and as congregations, to work toward restoring creation.

From the report: “Earth-keeping today means insisting on sustainability—the ongoing capacity of natural and social systems to thrive together—which requires human beings to practice wise, humble, responsible stewardship, after the model of servanthood that we have in Jesus.”

Sustainability Matters is a regular column focusing on issues of sustainability in our church, our denomination, our community, and around the world. The Presbyterian Church affirmed in 1990 that restoring creation was to be “incorporated into [the church's] life and mission at every level.” It is our hope that the Trinity community will embrace this call as fervently as our denomination has.
