A long-time Trinity partner in mission, the Druid Hills Night Shelter offers dinner, a shower, a night's safe sleep and breakfast for 30 men who have just secured work or are actively seeking work. Trinity is responsible for the evening meal on the 4th Thursday and 5th Monday. Volunteers are needed to prepare and serve the meal. The volunteers arrive at 6:30 and are finished by 8 pm. ### **Deliver meals to homebound seniors one morning a month.**

With Meals on Wheels, volunteers deliver meals (prepared by Senior Citizen Services) five days a week to a regular route of seven clients in the Bolton Road area. Volunteers drive in pairs (women, men, couples). Most have a scheduled day while others "float" and are assigned each month. The prepared meals are picked up at Trinity at 10:00 am, and volunteers are usually finished within one hour. Join nearly 50 other volunteers on one of Trinity's original hands-on mission projects!

### **Tutor a neighborhood student at the Agape Center for 1 hour a week.**

The Agape Center, a Trinity partner for over 10 years, provides programs and resources for the residents of the Bolton Road community, specifically vulnerable families, kids, and senior citizens. The after-school tutoring program takes place at the Trinity campus and at the Agape Center on Bolton Road. Mentors are needed for all ages of students, elementary through high school. Special post-graduation career/college mentoring is needed for 11th and 12th graders through Agape's Ginger Kaney Mentoring Institute.
